The Open and Affordable Textbooks Program is an incentive program that awards research funds to Rutgers faculty who make their courses more affordable for their students. To date, the program has brought an estimated savings of over \$2 million to students at Rutgers University–Camden, Rutgers University–New Brunswick, Rutgers University–Newark, and Rutgers Biomedical and Health Sciences. Our goal is to support textbook affordability at Rutgers, promote the use of open and affordable educational resources, and empower faculty to innovate their teaching through the use of open, free, or library–licensed materials and teaching aids.

The OAT Program awards research funds to full- and part-time faculty who are willing to:

- Adopt: Replace a traditional textbook with a free, low-cost, or open alternative
- Innovate: Replace a traditional textbook with articles, book excerpts, audio, or video that are licensed through Rutgers University Libraries, open access, or freely available online
- Create: Replace a traditional, high-cost textbook with one that they will design, author, and provide for free or at low cost to students
- Remix: Replace a traditional textbook with existing open educational resources to meet your student needs.


One of the biggest challenges Rutgers faculty face in converting their courses to low- or no-cost is finding discipline-specific, appropriate, and rigorous materials. The links on this site are selected to promote discovery of open and affordable educational resources.

Start Here

The Open Textbook Library is a multidisciplinary curated list of open textbooks. It is a great place to find best-bet texts in your discipline. The standards for inclusion in the Open Textbook Library are that the book must be available to download at no cost and/or printed at low cost and that it must be used at multiple higher education institutions; or be in some other way associated with an institution, scholarly society, or professional organization. Additionally, many of these books have been reviewed by faculty to assess their quality. The Open Textbook Library is supported by the Center for Open Education and the Open Textbook Network.

There is no comprehensive way to search for open course materials, but <u>The Metafinder</u> from George Mason University provides a one-stop search of most major repositories, including OER Commons, OpenStax, and BC Commons.

Z-courses at RVCC

A "z-course" is a course for which there is zero cost for textbooks or course materials. In these courses, students are still required to consult course materials throughout their learning, but those materials are freely available to the students, often through Canvas, library databases or ebook collections, or internet resources. In some cases, a printed version of the materials may be available for purchase from the RVCC Bookstore or can be printed for free or for a small fee from the website where it is published. Your instructor will provide you with more information about how the course materials can be accessed. In certain courses, only specific professors run the course as a z-course. Check the "Instructor" column on the chart for which professors run z-course sections.

Free Digital Textbooks vs. Purchased Commercial Textbooks

Open educational resources have saved students millions of dollars, but can they also improve students' grades?

A large-scale study at the University of Georgia has found that college students provided with free course materials at the beginning of a class get significantly better academic results than those that do not.

The Georgia study, published this week, compared the final grades of students enrolled in eight large undergraduate courses between 2010 and 2016. Each of these courses was taught by a professor who switched from a commercial textbook costing \$100 or more to a free digital textbook, or open

Students at Rutgers University spend an average of \$1,500 annually just on their course materials, according to data from the independent New Jersey Public Interest Research Group.

That prompted the creation of the Open and Affordable Textbooks Program, through which the Rutgers University Library System awards grants to campus faculty members to cover the costs of textbooks for students.

The program, Rutgers said, has assisted more than 11,000 students on its three campuses and Rutgers Biomedical and Health Sciences, saving them \$2.1 million since 2016.

Krisellen Maloney, vice president for information services and university librarian at Rutgers, launched the OAT initiative.

"Rutgers President Robert Barchi said he wanted it to happen," Maloney said. " ... The rollout went much better than I





A textbook must meet all of the following criteria to be considered for the Open Textbook Library:

- Has an open license that allows for derivatives
- Is a complete book (not individual chapters) available as a portable file (e.g. PDF, ePub)
- Is currently in use at multiple higher educational institutions, or affiliated with a higher education institution, scholarly society, or professional organization
- Is an original textbook (not a derivative of another textbook) or is for an entirely new audience
