25th Annual Users' Conference Friday, January 5, 2024

Highlights:

- Registered: 251
- Attendees: 209 (includes 22 Exhibitors)
- Cancellation: 16 people sent emails confirming they will not make it
- Session Cancellations- No sessions were canceled, but 1 portion of a Lightning Talk session was canceled due to the speakers being unable to attend.
- No shows: 26
- Keynote speaker: Emily Drabinski

Summary of Achievements

- Participation in Planning Committee: This year, 18 Librarians across the state participated in the conference's planning. A complete list of the participants is available on the conference program

- **Double Blind Peer Review of all Proposals-** This year, the proposal form was edited to include an *anonymous abstract* to ensure blind peer review of all submissions.
- Theme Alignment- This year, both Breakout & Poster committees followed up with several
 presenters and requested they revise their abstracts to better align with the theme. All presenters
 complied.
- Commemoration of VALE's 25th anniversary- a slideshow shared photos from 24 years of conferences, specialty cupcakes were offered, and a special VALE history trivia event was held.
- **NJLA Store** opened at the conference for the first time.
- Online Conference Program- The first conference utilizing an online program with a single-sheet abridged version for attendees.

Issues to Be Considered Further

• Planning Timeline

The Planning committee moved the planning timeline back compared to previous conferences, with earlier due dates for all conference planning steps. The committee was unanimous that this made the planning process much easier. The earlier timeline also afforded the VALE EC greater inclusivity in the planning process.

- **Proposal Timeline-** The committee discussed the idea of separating the proposal timeline. Having an earlier window for Breakout proposals followed by a window for Poster sessions. Many conferences follow this model.
- Registration form additional questions- Recommend either of the following
 - 1. adding a question to the conference registration form asking attendees to grant permission for the Conference Planning committee to share their contact information with Conference sponsors.
 - 2. A disclaimer that registration consents to their contact info being shared with conference sponsors.

- **No-shows-** The large number of no-shows is concerning. Without some form of incentive, deterrent, or investment, no-shows will continue to hamper conference planning.
- Conference Program- using an online program eliminates the traditional practice of a competitive artwork for the program cover- Recommend replacing the cover artwork contest with a conference logo contest.

- The survey results commenting on the physical space were overwhelmingly positive.
- Several respondents provided positive feedback on the conference communication including their session choices
- The keynote was well-received.
 - 96.6% of respondents attended the Keynote
 - 39 respondents provided qualitative feedback
 - 100% of comments were positive
 - When asked to rate the importance of a Keynote at future conferences on a 1-5 scale
 - **5-44.3**%
 - **4**-34.1%
 - **3-17%**
 - **2-2.3%**
 - **1-2.3%**

Sponsor Feedback

- 69.3% of respondents indicated they visited a sponsor/exhibitor table during the conference
- 76.8% of respondents who visited a table found the information at the Exhibitor tables useful to their work.
- 82.5% of respondents who visited a table believed the exhibitors provided "value" to their conference experience.
- 85.2% of respondents visited the NJLA Store
- 83.6% of respondents would like to see the NJLA store at future conferences
