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The New Academic Ecosystem

- Higher education is rapidly evolving, becoming increasingly technology-driven and interdisciplinary, which requires greater collaboration.
- Contrary to predictions, the IT Revolution not replaced the libraries but expanded their mission.
- Libraries are evolving from being repositories to active partners in teaching and learning



Libraries Beyond Walls

- Design and architecture emphasize collaboration and teamwork in distinctive and essential ways.
- Students expect institutions, especially libraries, to exemplify and support collaborative practices
- They are becoming hubs of intellectual, creative, and social exchange, essential sources of human expertise, places to explore, experiment, collaborate, and inspire.



From supporters to partners, from repository to collaborative space

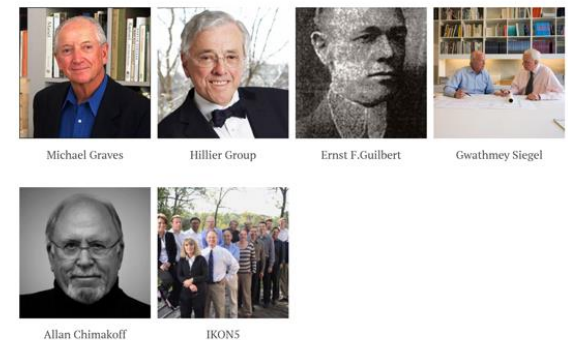
- Faculty recognize librarians as co-educators and subject specialists
- Librarians curate discipline-specific collections, create online tutorials, research guides, and other teaching materials.
- Librarians provide expert reference assistance and subject consultations. Information literacy is embedded across curricula.
- Librarians act as facilitators and recorders of ongoing curriculum development and institutional history.



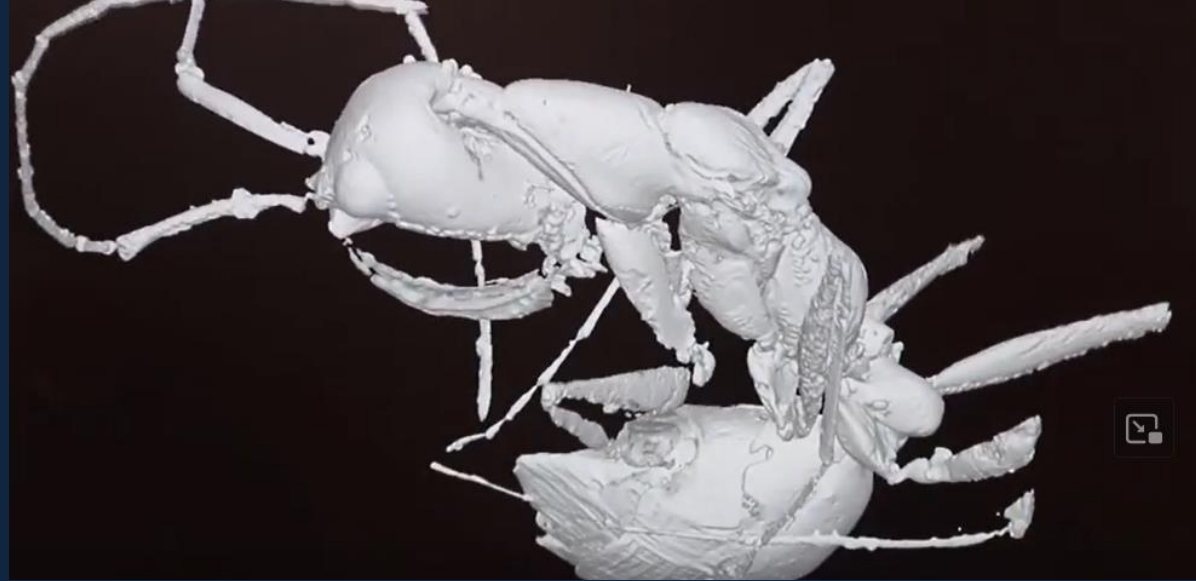
Select Digital Projects: Building Community



- Digital Archive of Newark Architecture (DANA) (dananjit.omeka.net) is a collaborative repository of materials focused on Newark's built environment.
- It supports courses across the campus, helps preserve collective memory, and encourages discussions about the city's past, present, and future.
- Students and faculty contribute to the Archive their research and creative work becoming co-authors rather than simply users.

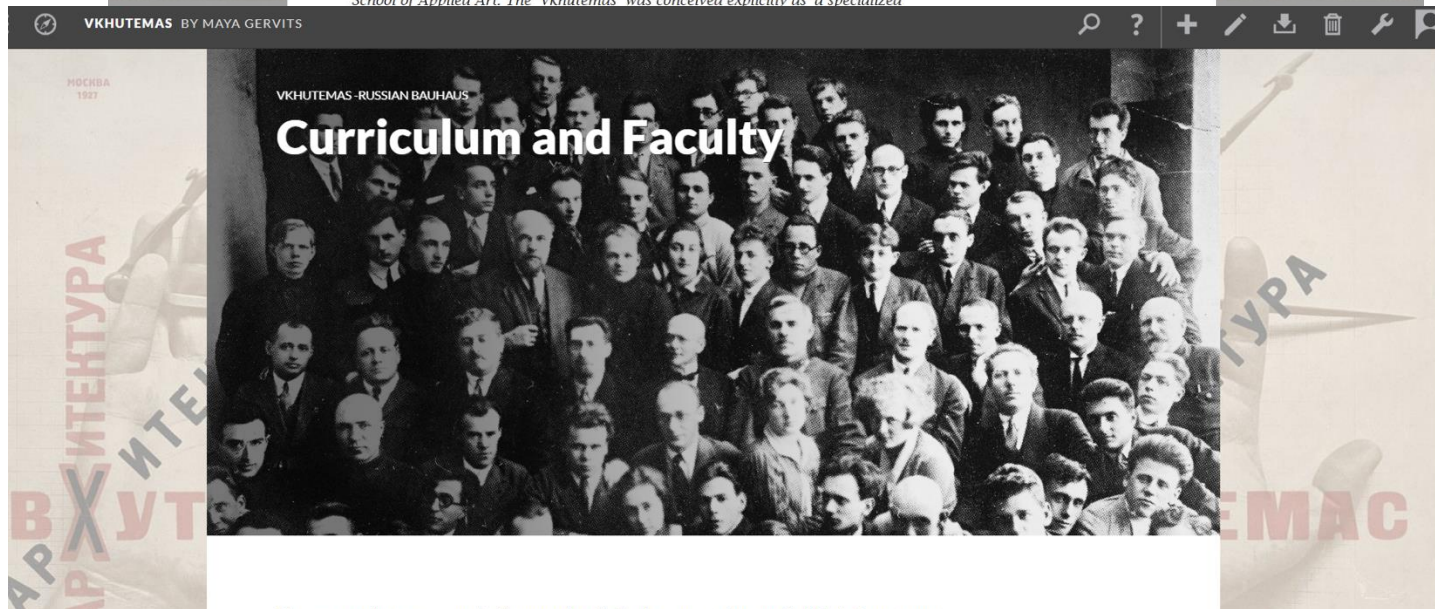


Digital Scholarship Lab

Mental Hygiene Bureau

As the result of our work during the past year we have begun to appreciate the importance of educating the public more definitely with regard to what mental hygiene really is. People have not yet learned to realize that there is a fundamental difference between psychiatry and mental hygiene. Psychiatry is that part of mental medicine which deals with the treatment of mental disorder. Mental hygiene is the science of the prevention of mental disorder by adjustments of behavior. It is concerned with the problems of the individual as a whole, the development of his personality and his relations to the community and his environment.

Mental Hygiene

In the early 20th century, offices of public health around the country made efforts to develop programs and outfit facilities with the necessary medical accommodations for those suffering from mental illness. A new emphasis on "mental hygiene" and an increasing reliance on science and biology as the underlying cause of mental illness prompted state and city officials to document and report on mental health cases, data, treatment, and facility solutions. The Essex County Hospital for the Insane was described as having a "well appointed pathological laboratory, the patients are scientifically and humanely cared for and everything connected with the institution and the management of the patients seems worthy of

commendation." (New Jersey Legislative Documents, vol. 5, 1908). Organized in 1872, The Essex County Hospital for the Insane located on South Orange Avenue, administered to both accute and chronic cases of mental illness (Urquhart, 1913). Overbrook, a more expansive facility would later be erected in Cedar Grove, NJ.

In an attempt to quantify and describe symptoms that were often times varied and imperceptible, doctors and other medical personnel sometimes relied on moralistic, vague, and biased characterizations.

Student Engagement and Belonging

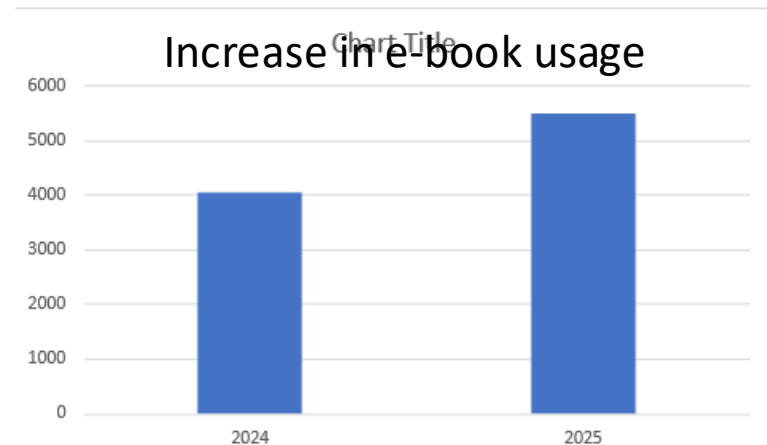
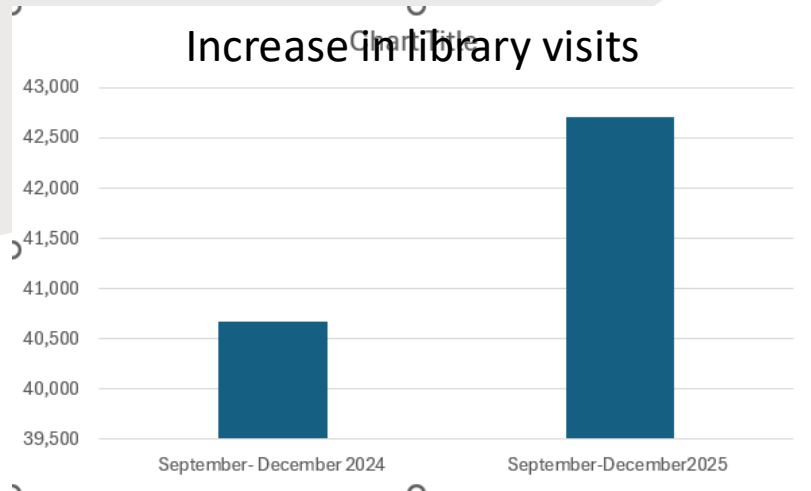
- Library functions as an inclusive community space.

- increased print book circulation and expanded use of e-books.

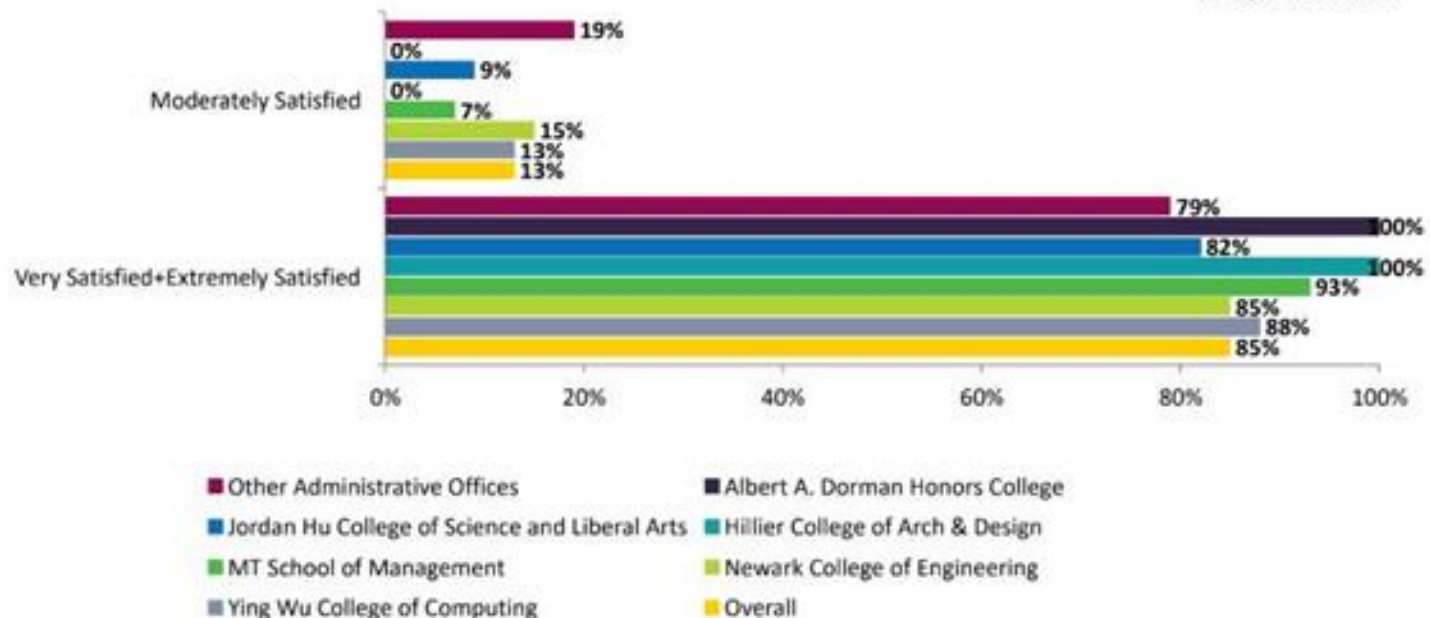


Survey Results
