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## 2026 New Jersey Academic Libraries Conference - LibraryLinkNJ Update

On behalf of LibraryLinkNJ, its Executive Board and staff, I would like to wish everyone a happy and healthy new year. Thank you for this opportunity to participate in this year's conference and report on the recent activities of LibraryLinkNJ.

### Collaboration and Partnerships

In September, we announced the launch of our new on-demand training series, **Information Literacy: A Guide for New Jersey Communities**. These on-demand learning modules are a small piece of a larger effort to prepare not only New Jersey's libraries, but its communities, for the upcoming Information Literacy Student Learning Standards, which will require comprehensive information literacy education in all of the Garden State's K-12 public schools. Our goal with these modules - part of the IMLS-funded Teaching Information Literacy project spearheaded by the New Jersey State Library - is to provide a resource that can be used to help all interested parties gain a preliminary understanding of what information literacy is and why it's so important. In December, we released the fourth of the five-part series of modules with the final module being released later this month.

### Counting on School Librarians: Help Map School Library Staffing Across NJ

This anonymous data will help identify where additional library support is needed most. EDI-NJ has launched the [EDI-NJ Institutional Assessment Pilot Project](#), a statewide initiative helping New Jersey libraries deepen their equity, diversity, and inclusion (EDI) practices through structured assessment, reflection, and action. We invited libraries across New Jersey to apply for participation at no cost in a collaborative pilot designed to test, refine, and apply the EDI-NJ Institutional Equity, Diversity & Inclusion Assessment Tool.

The following eight libraries applied before the December 12 deadline and were approved for inclusion in the pilot:

- Burlington County Library System
- Hunterdon County Library System
- Jennings Library at Caldwell University
- John P. Faber School (Middlesex Co.)
- Moorestown Library
- New Brunswick Free Public Library
- Piscataway Public Library
- University Library at Rider University

Participating libraries will:

- Deepen their organizational understanding of equity, diversity, and inclusion (EDI).
- Receive individualized consulting (1-hour onboarding debrief and 4 hours of consulting) with an EDI consultant to interpret results and create actionable plans.
- Contribute valuable feedback that will inform the statewide EDI Framework for NJ Libraries and shape future implementation.

**Reminder: EDI-NJ Institutional EDI Assessment for New Jersey Libraries**

Please help us continue to get the word out about this comprehensive tool designed to support a library's journey toward creating a more equitable, inclusive, and community-centered institution. In addition to the assessment, we are excited to introduce the [Learning Module Series](#) that accompanies the tool. This series is designed to guide a library through each step of the process, helping an organization reflect on its current state, understand community needs, and identify actionable areas for growth. **Resource Sharing and Delivery**

- Our new agreement with TForce Logistics went into effect on July 1, 2025.
- Currently, the Statewide Delivery Service provides delivery for **285 library administrative entities**:
  - Public Libraries - 194
  - K-12 Schools - 39
  - Academic Libraries - 45
  - Other Library-Related Agencies - 7

**Materials Acquisition Resources**

We have partnered with NJLA to support New Jersey libraries in navigating the transition in materials acquisition following Baker & Taylor's announcement in October that they are ceasing operations.
